



YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN NEBRASKA

Election Day: **Tuesday, November 5, 2024**
Polls Open **8am CT / 7am MT** to **8pm CT / 7pm MT**



Who can Vote?

- You can vote if you are a U.S. citizen, are at least 18 years old on Election Day, a resident of the Nebraska county in which you are registering, you have completed your sentence if previously convicted of a felony including any probation or parole, and are registered to vote.
- Here is how you can register to vote:
 - **By mail** postmarked by **October 18** to your county election office. Find your county election office here: <https://sos.nebraska.gov/elections/election-officials-contact-information>
 - **Online** by **October 18** here: <https://www.nebraska.gov/apps-sos-voter-registration/>
 - **In person** at your county election office by 6 p.m. **October 25**.

Can I vote by mail?

- **Yes.** Registered voters can apply to **vote-by-mail** by returning a completed form through mail, fax, or email to your local county election office. The deadline to request an **early-voting ballot** is **October 25** at 6:00 p.m. The application form is available here: <https://sos.nebraska.gov/elections/voter-forms>
- **Mail ballots** may be returned in person, through the mail, OR through a secure drop box location and must arrive at your local election authority **by 8 p.m. CT / 7 p.m. MT on November 5**.

When and where do I vote in person?

- Early voting begins on **October 7** and ends on **November 4**. Find your polling place here: <https://www.votercheck.necvr.ne.gov/voterview>
- On Election Day, November 5th, the polls are open **8 a.m. CT / 7 a.m. MT** to **8 p.m. CT / 7 p.m. MT**.

Do I need to show ID to vote?

- You must show an ID when you **vote early in-person** OR vote on **Election Day**. Acceptable forms of ID include: Nebraska driver's license or state ID, Nebraska college ID, Tribal ID, Military ID, U.S. Passport, Nebraska political subdivision ID (county, city, public school, etc.), or a hospital, assisted-living, or nursing home record. - If voting with a mail ballot, you will be required to include your driver's license number, state ID number, or provide a photocopy of your ID.
- If you do not have any of these forms of identification, you may cast a provisional ballot. Your ballot will count if you present a photo ID to your county election office **on or before Tuesday, November 12**.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

- **Yes.** If you need assistance with voting because you don't speak English or you have a disability, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer, your union representative, or any of their agents. The person you bring does not need to be a registered voter. If you need assistance and you do not bring someone, you may be assisted by two members of the Receiving Board.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

- You have the right to a Spanish ballot and help in Spanish if you live in **Colfax, Dakota, or Dawson** counties. In all counties, you can ask if the polling place has an ExpressVote machine with a Spanish ballot.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

- If your name is not on the list or your right to vote is challenged, you have the right to vote using a provisional ballot.
