

YOUR VOTING RIGHTS IN COLORADO Election Day: Tuesday, November 5, 2024



Who can vote?

- To vote in the election on November 5, you must be registered to vote. You can find out if you are registered here: <u>https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/findVoterReg.xhtml</u>.
- If you registered to vote before October 28, you will receive a mail ballot.
- You can register to vote online through October 28. You can register online here: <u>https://www.sos.state.co.us/voter/pages/pub/olvr/verifyNewVoter.xhtml</u>.
- If you miss these deadlines, you can register in person at a polling location through Election Day. Learn more at: http://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/FAQs/VoterRegistrationFAQ.html.
- To register to vote, you must:
 - be 18 years of age or older at the time of the election;
 - o be a United States citizen;
 - o be a Colorado resident for at least 22 days before the election; and
 - not currently incarcerated for a felony sentence.

When do I vote?

- Early voting begins October 21. Early voting locations are open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.
- On Election Day, Tuesday, November 5, the polls are open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Can I vote by mail?

- Yes, **all voters** in Colorado who registered before October 28 are sent mail ballots and can vote by mail if they choose this option.
- If this is your first time voting by mail, you may need to provide a copy of your ID. You can find acceptable forms of ID here: <u>www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/vote/acceptableFormsOfID.html</u>.
- No later than 7 p.m. on Election Day, your mail ballot must be received by the county clerk. You can either mail your ballot or drop it off at one of the designated locations. You can find the closest drop off location here: https://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/VIP.html.

Where do I vote in person?

How do I vote in person?

• All voters who want to vote in person **must provide ID that shows your name and address.** You can find a list of acceptable forms of ID here: <u>https://www.coloradosos.gov/pubs/elections/vote/acceptableFormsOfID.html</u>. The address on your ID does <u>not</u> have to match your voter registration but does have to show a Colorado address.

Can I bring someone to help me vote?

• Yes. If you need assistance with voting because you don't speak English or have a disability, you can bring a person into the voting booth to help you vote. You can bring any person that you want except your employer, your union representative, or their agents. The person you bring does not need to be a registered voter.

Can I receive assistance in Spanish?

• Yes. In Colorado, you are entitled to bilingual voting materials and assistance in Spanish in several counties. You can find the list of counties here: <u>https://www.sos.state.co.us/pubs/elections/multiBallot.html</u>.

What if my name is not on the list of voters?

• If your name is not on the list, or there is a problem with your ID, you have the right to vote on a provisional ballot. Be sure to ask for a provisional ballot if you are not given a regular ballot.
